The four graphs in the Source of Income Rates summary and those sources of income all influence one another. There are two sources of income that may require some explanation. Employment income includes wages, salaries, commissions and income earned through self-employment. Government transfers covers a broad range of government support that includes Employment Insurance (EI), the Old Age Security (OAS) pension, the Canadian Pension Plan (CPP), GST credits, child tax benefits, workers compensation, family benefits, provincially refundable tax credits and other government transfers.

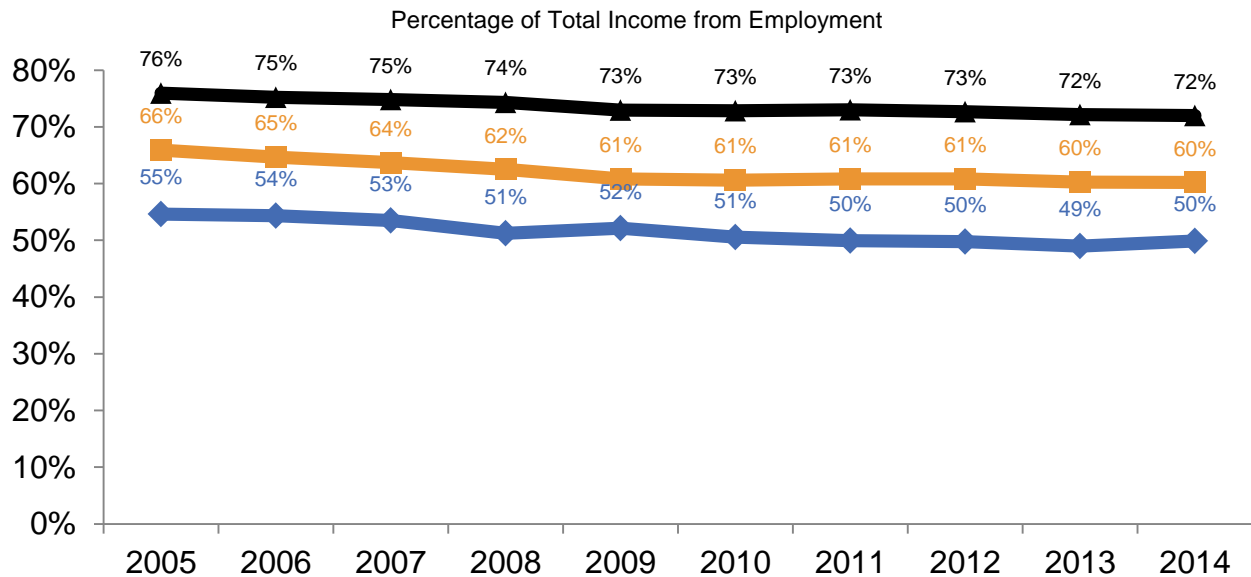
Based on our older population in the City of Kawartha Lakes (City) and the County of Haliburton (County) it should not be unexpected that income from employment is at a lower rate in the City and County when compared to Ontario.

Likewise, income from pensions and government transfers is much higher in the City and County than in Ontario as a whole.

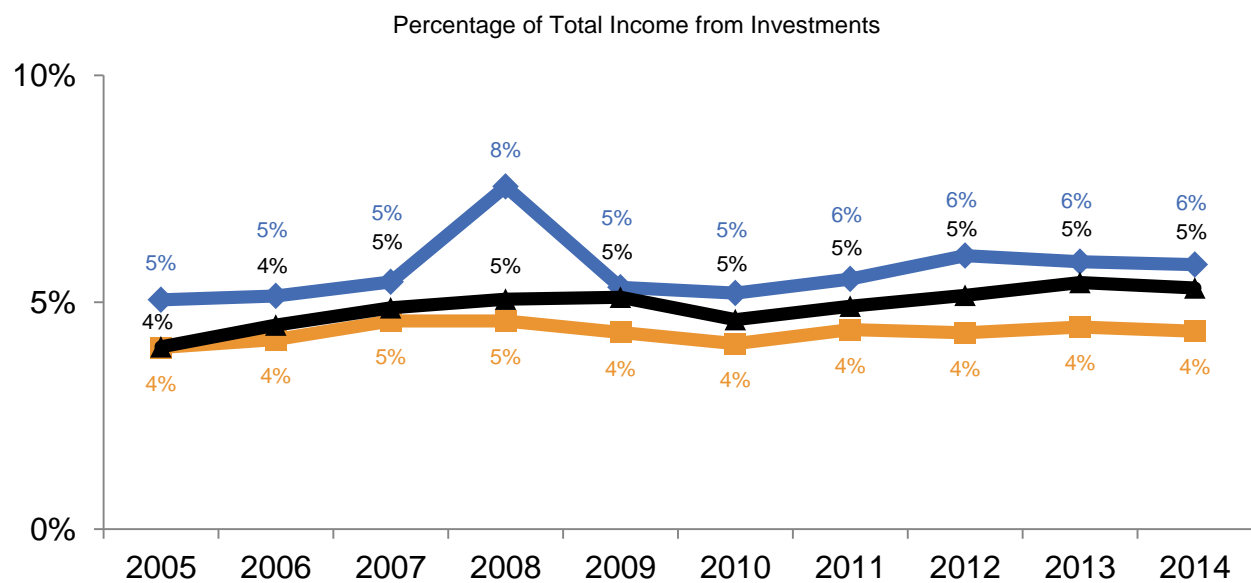

What is Employment Income?

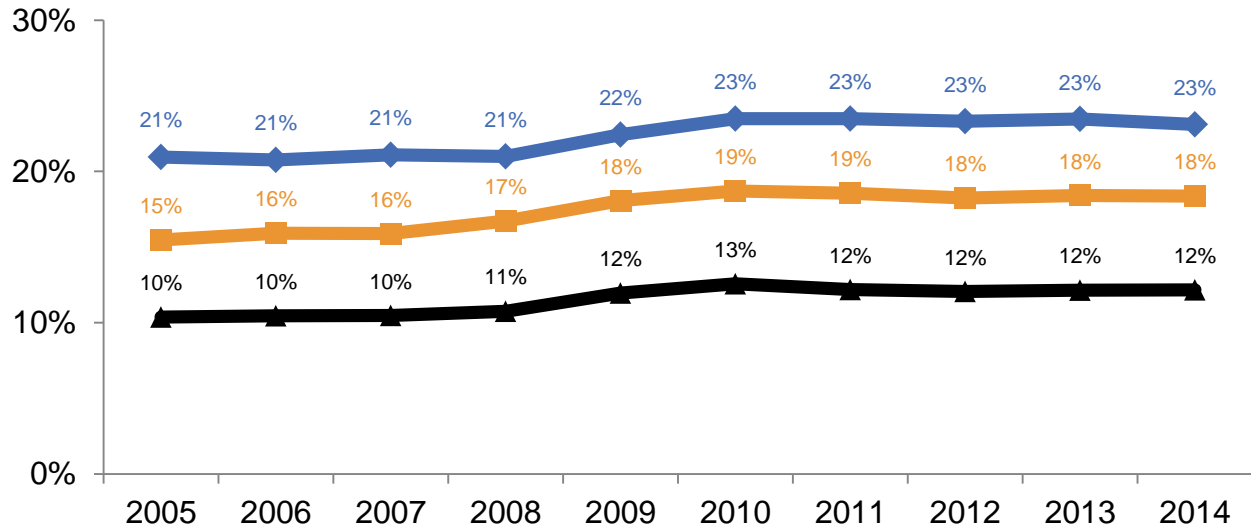
- Employment income includes:

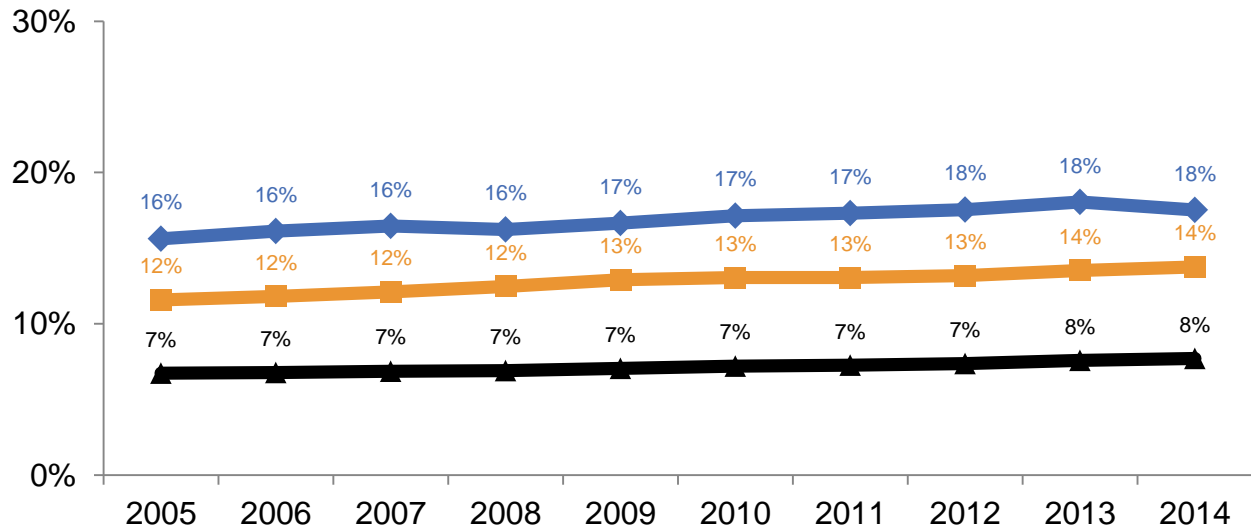
Government Transfers
