

- Considering creating a dashboard related to inflation



- Activity Limitations Table 1: Age (18), Sex (3), Activity limitation frequency (7) and Activity limitation type (9), for the Population in Private Households
- population by structural type of dwelling? at custom geos
- <u>Selected Language, Labour Force, Education, Income and Mobility Status Characteristics</u>
 (73), <u>Admission Category and Applicant Type</u> (13), <u>Period of Immigration</u> (15) and <u>Sex</u>
 (3)
- Selected household and housing characteristics (28), Admission category and applicant type (13), Period of immigration (16) and Sex (3) for the Population in Private Households
- Shelter cost groups (18), Household type (9), Age groups of primary household maintainer (9), Housing tenure including presence of mortgage and subsidized housing (7)

Activity Limitations

The question on activities of daily living in the 2021 Census of Population asked the following:

Does this person have any:

- 1. difficulty seeing (even when wearing glasses or contact lenses)?
- 2. difficulty hearing (even when using a hearing aid)?
- 3. difficulty walking, using stairs, using their hands or fingers or doing other physical activities?
- 4. difficulty learning, remembering or concentrating?
- 5. emotional, psychological or mental health conditions (e.g., anxiety, depression, bipolar disorder, substance abuse, anorexia, etc.)?
- 6. other health problem or long-term condition that has lasted or **is expected to last for six months or more**? Exclude: any health problems previously reported in questions 18 a) to 18 e) above.


Sub-municipal geographies

- 1. What level of sub-municipal geography is most preferred within your organization/department?
 - Wards (CKL)
 - 8 Human Services Neighbourhoods (CKL and Haliburton)
 - Aggregate Dissemination Areas (ADA)
 - Other
- 2. How does your organization/department assign data to the appropriate geography?
 - Street Address
 - Postal Code
 - Only receive data from Ministry/Province/Municipality
 - Other

CKL Wards – last updated in 2018

Considerations:

- balance population between wards, (variance not to exceed 20%) based on census population data
- non-resident population
- variations in population densities
- established settlement patterns and existing communities
- physical features as natural boundaries or
- effective representation for all electors




CKL Wards

Limitations for Data Analysis:


- Challenging to perform spatial analysis
- Lots split in half, don't follow road centerlines
- Postal Codes do not align

Up for review in 2027-2029



Human Services Neighbourhoods

- 8 areas made up of Census Dissemination Areas
- Created to report Early
 Development Instrument (EDI)
 data
 - At least 100 responses per area
- Aligns with Census geography
 - DA's in CKL and Haliburton
 - ADA's in Haliburton
- Custom Geography through CDP
- Postal codes may not align accurately
- Do other organizations/departments use these boundaries?




Aggregate Dissemination Area (ADA)

- Created in 2016
- Population of 5,000 to 15,000 where possible
- 8 ADAs (CKL)
- 2 ADAs (Haliburton)

Limitations/Challenges

- May not follow existing settlement boundaries (e.g. Omemee and Coboconk split in half)
- Postal codes may not align accurately
